PE and Sports Premium Funding Review 2016 – 2017

For the academic year, Pirton School was allocated £8,555, together with a carry forward of £3,527 giving a total for the year of **£12,167**.

Key Actions	Cost	Outcome/ Impact
Employment of sports apprentice.	£7,182	Children and staff were supported in PE lessons to ensure all children were included and able to achieve at different levels. Targeted groups of children were supported during PE lessons and during break times and lunchtimes, to develop skills and ability. Profile of sport was raised across school and children were supported in external events.
Membership of North Herts School Sports Partnership (NHSSP)	£555	School participated in four local sporting events, competing against local schools. Continued professional development to ensure sustainability of PE provision.
Transport and associated costs for participation in local sporting events.	£720	The cost of transport to the above events was met by school rather than parents, allowing all to participate equally.
Additional storage for PE equipment.	£1430	Outdoor storage to house PE resources was purchased and equipment was organised accordingly. This increased space in the hall for indoor PE and facilitated easy access to PE equipment thus maximising lesson time.
Professional development for teachers.	£475	PE subject leader was released from teaching to assist with organisation of events and to attend CPD opportunities. This was later disseminated to staff.
Swimming lessons for KS2 children who did not initially meet National Curriculum expected standard.	£35	1/1 child was able to complete the training and successfully achieved the National Curriculum Standard for swimming at the end of KS2
