

## English

Continue reading a range of texts with and to your child, on a daily basis talking about what has been read.

Read, perform and discuss some play scripts written for children, perhaps moving on to writing a play script of their own.

Research age appropriate non-fiction texts, including newspapers.

Continue practising and applying spellings from previous weeks.

## Mathematics

Continue practising multiplication tables with your child. Also, board and card games are helpful to aid/maintain fluency with small numbers.

Practice telling the time with your children throughout the day using both digital, analogue and Roman numeral clocks.

Please take any opportunity to discuss bus or train timetables to calculate intervals of time.

## Science

Take the opportunity sometimes to talk about the food that you eat, in terms of which food group it belongs to and how healthy it is; perhaps drawing children's attention to the 'traffic lights' on the packaging.

**PSHE:** talk about changes that may be happening in class, at home and in your child's emotional and physical being.

## R.E

## Geography

Identify key locations in the UK and place them on a map. Find out what our major cities are known for and why. Can children name counties and county towns?

## Computing

Discuss how to be safe when using simulations and blogging sites.

Identify why different simulations are used.

## Art and Design

Provide a range of sketching materials and allow your child to sketch when out and about.

## Design and Technology

Revisit some basic cooking skills such as weighing and mixing.

## P.E

Encourage your child to be as active as possible. Children should be aiming to be active for 1 hour a day, but only 30 minutes of this is provided within school. Can they invent a new game at home which involves all players to be active?

## Languages

Encourage your child to talk in different languages, using greetings and simple phrases as appropriate. Find out how children in other countries go to school.
