- I can label objects around the house (post-it notes are fun for this)
- I can write short sentences about things I have done (I could have my own special diary to keep these notes in)
- I can talk to you about my school day
- I can listen to stories and talk about how the events in the stories are similar to experiences I have had
- I can find a poem on the internet about my favourite thing and print it out

PSHE

- I can make a family tree to show who is in my family and how they are related to me
- I can draw a picture of myself and label all the parts

RE

- I can find out if I can donate food to a local food bank or charity for Harvest Festival
- I can retell the nativity story to someone in my family

Music

- I can sing along to songs I like
- I can learn the words to my favourite Christmas songs

P.E.

- I can jump in different ways
- I can play with a ball with my family and friends

Mathematics

- I can recognise and say numbers to 50 even if they are not in the correct order
- I can use different objects in the house to make my own addition and subtraction sums
- I can use the internet to find games to support me learning my times tables
- I can split my dinner into two equal parts (half) and then four equal parts (quarters). This is fun with pasta and peas!
- I can borrow a tape measure and measure different things in my house and garden. I can make a chart to show how long each thing is
- I can find out what a compass is and how it is used
- I can go on a shape hunt to find 2D and 3D shapes in my local area

Science

- I can find out about animals that interest me and create my own 'fact file'
- I can make my own sensory pots which allow me to explore the five senses
- I can use the internet to find out the correct names for the different parts of my body
- I can explore trees in my local area and learn their names
- I can make leaf rubbings and say which tree the leaf has come from
- I can notice and talk about the changes from summer to autumn and autumn to winter

Computing

- I can login to an online programme with support from an adult
- I can explore Purple Mash and complete some of the activities

Geography

- I can find the UK on a world map
- I can colour a map of the world in blue and green (green for the countries, blue for the oceans)
