## English

Over the course of this term we will be writing instructions and directions. Following this we will be combining traditional tales with adventure stories. Children will then have the opportunity to write across a range of genres to consolidate their knowledge and skills. During the second half term we will be studying the narrative poem 'The Highwayman' by Alfred Noyes and writing an alternative ending. There will be many other opportunities for the children to write explanation and discussion texts through our learning in Science and Topic.

**History – Changes in Social History: Crime and Punishment**  
The children will be revisiting some of the eras they have studied in the past such as the Anglo-Saxons, Vikings, Romans and Tudors to investigate the ways in which society has changed through the ages. They will relate this learning to British Values and the Rule of Law.

The children will also study the Georgian era and link work on Dick Turpin with their Literacy learning of 'The Highwayman'.

## Art

Our theme this term is 'City Scapes.' The children will be studying the work of Lowry and completing their own sketches.

### Crime and Punishment

## PSHE:

Our themes for this term are: Living Long and Living Strong and 'Daring to be Different.'

Our SEAL topics are Good to be Me and Going for Goals.

RE: In the first half term we will be considering 'Belonging' and signs and symbols of Sikhism. We will then think about Easter traditions and food symbols.

## Science: Forces

Children will:

Explain that unsupported objects fall towards the Earth because of the force of gravity acting between the Earth and the falling object by identifying forces acting on objects:  
Identify the effects of air resistance by investigating the best parachute to slow a person down;

Identify the effects of water resistance by creating and racing streamlined boats:

Identify the effects of friction;

Recognise that some mechanisms, including levers, pulleys and gears, allow a smaller force to have a greater effect by exploring and designing a simple mechanism.

## Computing – Blogging

The children will consider what blogs are used for and whether they are a formal or informal mode of communication. They will consider the features of a blog and design their own pages. The children will then plan and write content for their blog and consider e-safety.
